Raise Your Voice: Impact Through Advocacy is an interactive keynote presentation taking participants behind the scenes of Pennsylvania's budget process, exploring what happens leading up to the passage of the budget and what it takes to

get an initiative on the radar of policymakers and across the finish line.

Jen will share practical insights into how advocacy proposals are developed to address unmet needs and the benefits of greater investment in high-quality early care and education. Attendees will learn about different opportunities to advocate with PennAEYC and its advocacy partners —whether they have just a few minutes or more time to commit—and will leave with clear, actionable ways to engage. Designed to be both informative and participatory, the session will highlight how collective advocacy strengthens outcomes for early educators and programs and children and families alike.

Jen is a coalition leader, advocate and policy expert with over 25 years of experience advancing high-quality early childhood care and education and human services in Pennsylvania. She currently provides leadership and daily management of PennAEYC's programmatic work and operations as Executive Director, guiding the implementation of the organization's strategic plan in collaboration with the Board of Directors. Jen serves as the lead spokesperson for PennAEYC with the media, funders and strategic partners. She has played a pivotal role in shaping statewide early care and education advocacy efforts, including the launch of Start Strong PA, a nonpartisan child care campaign, and serving as the co-chair of the Early Learning PA coalition.

Her career spans state government and nonprofit organizations, where she has held senior roles in policy development, government relations and advocacy for children and families and the professionals who serve them. She is proud to have contributed to the efforts resulting in the creation of Pennsylvania's Office of Child Development and Early Learning and enactment of several state laws including establishment of the new Child Care Staff Recruitment and Retention Program. Jen holds a bachelor's degree in political science from Susquehanna University and the Certified Nonprofit Professional credential.
